# XC Ski / Snowshoe Trips

## January 27 - Brunch & Ski at the South Fork

Brunch & Ski at the South Fork Lodge Nordic Center trail system. 20k of the trails are groomed for skating as well as traditional diagonal stride. An additional 14k is groomed for skate skiing only (which translates to lots of herringboning on traditional gear if one is following a skater). We'll ski, eat, and ski some more. Trail Fees are \$12 per day but if we can get a large enough group together we may be able to swing a discount. Brunch at the restaurant along the banks of the Snake River is fabulous. If you have a Targhee Vertical Value Pass the food is 15% off or Idaho Falls Ski Club members can show their membership card for a 10% discount on the food. #### February 16 - 17 - Teton Canyon Overnight
