REMEMBER TO RENEW January 9 - Extreme Snowboarder Show in Idaho Falls

World class mountaineer and snowboarder Stephen Koch of Jackson, Wyoming will present a show at the Colonial Theater in Idaho Falls at 7:30 pm Friday, January 9th. The show will feature the photography of another top notch mountaineer, Jimmy Chin.

Admission to the show will be a can of food and \$1. Food will go to support local food banks.

Koch, who works as an Exum Mountain Guide, is the first person to snowboard off the summit of the Grand Teton and down the Black Ice Couloir. He has many first ascents and descents on peaks throughout the world.

Koch was the first to snowboard Kilimanjaro in east Africa, Puncak Jaya in New Guinea and Vinson Massif in Antarctica. Koch and Chin recently returned from a trip to Mount Everest where they attempted to climb and snowboard the difficult north side of the mountain.

At 34 years old, Koch has accomplished more than 40 first descents, many of which have never been repeated. Between trips and guiding for Exum, he teaches avalanche awareness to young people through his nonprofit, the Avalanche Awareness and Education Fund.

Through the Avalanche Awareness and Education Fund, Stephen uses his experience to promote awareness of potential dangers to backcountry travelers of all ages.

Koch has been featured in Outside Magazine, Snowboard, Blue Magazine and Couloir Backcountry Adventure.

Local sponsors of the show include The Post Register's Let's Go! Section, Kelly Canyon Ski Resort, Red Ant Ski Shop in Idaho Falls, All Seasons Sports in Rexburg, and Peaked Sports in Driggs.

March 13-21 - Valley of Death, Yellowstone NP Snowshoe Winter Backpack

This moderately strenuous winter backpack snowshoe trip to a seldom visited, trail-less area, will be a hot springer's paradise, as our base camp will be located near a 100 degree large creek, that slowly gets warmer upstream (according to a reliable source).

We'll take 2 days to snowshoe the 8 miles (cross-country) to our base camp. From there, we'll do day hikes into 3 other nearby drainages to explore other thermal areas and waterfalls. We'll bring the 8-man tipi for warmth and camaraderie.

The approximate per person cost for gas, snowmobile shuttles, 1 night lodging, and satellite phone rental is \$125. As always, you must bring something special to share with the group. Limit 12. For more details or to sign up, contact Mike or Debbie Allen at 384-1545 (Boise) or madallen@ev1.net.

Harriman State Park and Kelly Canyon Notes:

During the upcoming winter, Harriman will receive two new pieces of grooming equipment which will allow us to better groom for classic skiing and to be more responsive to changing weather conditions on the skating lanes. We hope to have the new equipment in operation by mid-January.

As many of you know, fees for winter use at Harriman have changed. Two years of shrinking budgets have depleted funds needed to maintain quality grooming programs at Harriman and Ponderosa State Parks. To ensure that these two Nordic programs do not slip backwards and to allow for some potential for future growth, new fees have been implemented at each park. A Nordic Grooming Fee will now be assessed at Harriman in addition to the park's standard Motor Vehicle Entrance Fee. The cost of the Grooming Fee will be \$2.00 per person for each day of use.

This will be in addition to the current \$3.00 vehicle entrance fee. The Motor Vehicle Entrance Fee will increase from \$3.00 to \$4.00 on January 1, 2004. As a result of this new fee program, both Harriman and Ponderosa State Parks have been removed from the Park & Ski program. The Park & Ski pass will still be valid at other Park & Ski sites, but it will no longer be accepted at Harriman.

Annual/Season Pass options are available which can provide considerable savings. The park entrance fee may be paid for the entire year by purchasing a \$25.00 annual pass which attaches to your vehicle. This pass is

valid for the calendar year at all Idaho State Parks. If you have a second vehicle, an additional pass may be purchased for \$5.00. A family/season Grooming Pass is available as well. This pass will cover all members of your household for the entire ski season. It is also \$25.00. To purchase either pass, please contact park staff at park headquarters on your next visit. These fees also apply to those renting overnight facilities at Harriman. If you have scheduled an overnight trip to Harriman or are planning to, please inform members of your group of the new fees. The Nordic Grooming Fee will be in effect when Harriman begins grooming for the 03/04 winter season, which is anticipated next week. The funds generated will be used to maintain the existing Nordic program at Harriman and provide for future enhancements. Please call the park with any questions.

Idaho Falls Ski Club Kelly Canyon Ski Huts are now set up with a day use only warming hut on Morgan Summit that is a great stop for lunch. Additionally, the Idaho Falls Ski Club has a day / over night use warming hut set up about 2.2 miles from the end of the road at Kelly Canyon. The huts are open to the public. The huts are usually installed near then middle of December and taken down the Middle of March. Day use is unrestricted but in order not to have conflicts at night you must call Glen Hayes to reserve it for an overnight stay. His phone number is 523-6839. The tent makes an excellent lunch stop for day use and an exciting but comfortable overnight outing. Trail maps are located at the beginning of the trail and at the signing box."
