## XCSkiing / Snowshoeing

Ken Krivanek has kindly agreed to lead some trips while Donna is recovering from knee surgery.

### January 20, 2007 Craters of the Moon:

We plan to go out to Craters on the 20<sup>th</sup> to attend their Winter Ecology class or XCSki the loop. The trail is groomed with a groomer used in the 2002 Winter Olympics. Anyone interested in joining us out there will be responsible for making their own reservation for the free class. If this date is not convenient, the information on the class and dates follows.

Winter is a special time of year to visit Craters of the Moon. Explore a different side of Craters of the Moon on a Ranger guided winter ecology snowshoe walk and presentation. The workshop starts with a 45-60 minute classroom session followed by several hours out in the park on snowshoes. Snowshoes are available for use and there is no charge for these events. Reservations are required and participants need to be at least 10 years of age for this moderately strenuous walk. Call early to sign up for these popular excursions. Because of the continued public interest, six winter ecology snowshoe workshops will be held again this winter on the following Saturdays—1/6/2007, 1/20/2007,

1/27/2007, 2/3/2007, 2/10/2007, 2/17/2007. Each program meets at the visitor center and runs from 9:30 AM to about 3 PM. The snowshoe hike itself varies from easy to moderately strenuous and cover between 3 and 5 miles. Lunch is eaten out in the Monument. ### December 30, 2006: Fall River Ridge:

This is where I spent a cold night last year; I promise we will not do that again this year. The trailhead is a Park-n-Ski area and is located 10 miles east of Ashton on the Cave Falls Road. There are three loops that are suitable for beginners to the intermediate skier. The terrain consists of rolling hills dotted with meadows and stand of lodgepole pine and aspen trees. A parking area is at the trailhead. There are 7 to 8 miles of trails in this system. We will ski all three loops to give us a very nice day of skiing. ### January 20, 2007: Buffalo River:

The trailhead is a Park-n-Ski area and is located ¼ mile north of the Island Park Ranger Station near Ponds Lodge Resort. There are four large loops that are classified as beginner to intermediate. The terrain varies from gentle grades to downhill runs through tree groves. There are nine miles of trail in this area and offer views of the Island Park Reservoir, Box Canyon, and the Buffalo River. We will ski all or parts of all four loops that will provide a challenging day of skiing. Afterwards we will go to Ponds Lodge for a cozy dinner before heading back to Idaho Falls. ### January 27, 2007: Kelly Canyon

**Nordic Area:** The trailhead is adjacent to the Kelly Canyon Ski Resort. We will snowshoe about 6 to 7 miles. We will climb up the Big Slot trail to Shoer's Delight and parallel the segment of the Buckskin-Morgan Ridge Loop that traverses the ridge top. We will continue over to Morgan Summit and then shoe out to the Hawley Gulch Overlook before returning to the trailhead via FR 218. From there we will head to Heise Lodge for a well-deserved dinner before heading back to Idaho Falls. ### February 10, 2007: Teton Canyon:

The Teton Canyon Road is east of Idaho Falls near Driggs. The trail follows the Teton Canyon Road into the Teton Canyon Campground, which is where the trailhead up to Table Mountain starts. This is a 10-mile round trip ski that is considered to be an intermediate adventure due to its length. We will ski to the Campground where we will have a snack and then return to our cars. Before heading back to Idaho Falls we will stop for dinner at the Knotty Pine Restaurant in Victor. ### February 17, 2007: Bear Gulch/Mesa

**Falls Area:** The Park-n-Ski Area is located seven miles northeast of Ashton on Mesa Falls Forest Highway 47. The approximately 5-mile trail travels along the canyon rim and parallel the snowmobile trail out to the spectacular Lower and Upper Mesa Falls. Once to the falls we will return to the trailhead on the same trail we took out. The trail is recommended for intermediate skiers due to its length (9 to 10 miles). After returning to Ashton we will have dinner either at Big Jud or at another restaurant in town. ## Free Maps:

New color topographic maps are available for download from the Palisades Ranger District web site: [www.fs.fed.us/r4/caribou-targhee/caribou-targhee/palisades/maps](http://www.fs.fed.us/r4/caribou-targhee/caribou-targhee/palisades/maps). On this page there is an index map showing an 8 page map that covers the entire ranger district and connecting areas at a scale of 1:112,500. Each map must be downloaded separately and they can be pasted together to form one large map. Hard copies of these maps are not available from the FS.

There are also 12 more detailed "Specialty" maps covering specific trails. These maps are at a scale of 1:50,000 with shaded relief and are detailed enough to replace USGS topographic maps in most cases. Coordinates of trailheads and key intersections are provided. Since the files are large, a high speed internet connection is needed. The Palisades Ranger District Office has a limited number of hard copies of the detailed maps.

## Trip Reports:

### December 9

#### Annual Christmas Tree Cutting:

The weather was almost too warm when Norman and Jeanell Coyne, Steve and Pat Huntington, Ken Krivanek, and Sandra Pew, Joined the Whithams for the annual snowshoe trip to search out the perfect Christmas tree. The Coynes and the Whithams chopped down two lovely trees and hauled them out of Tie Canyon, which is in the Pine Creek Pass area. After providing adequate tree supervision, Steve, Pat, Ken, and Sandy snowshoed up Tie Canyon a ways and shared a sushi lunch. The Coynes and the Whithams towed their trees to their cars and stopped for a square ice-cream lunch.

### PARK 'N' SKI INFORMATION

While we all would prefer to ski free, Park N' Ski permits have financed much of the cross-country skiing development in Idaho during the past several years. Purchasing a pass provides a funding source for ski clubs and agencies interested in maintaining and developing cross-country skiing

facilities. Services offered to skiers vary from year to year depending on volunteer support, donations and revenue generated through the sale of Park N' Ski permits. Poor snow years and no support of the program often translate into low income, thus reduced services. When you purchase a \$20 annual permit, or a 3- day temporary permit for \$7.50, the money is dedicated by law to be used exclusively for improving cross-country skiing opportunities. As such, the program has been widely supported by Nordic skiers statewide. When skiers purchase a permit, they are asked to designate a specific Park N' Ski area they would like to see improved. This gives skiers greater control over how and where the funds are spent.

### Trail Etiquette & Safety

- Be considerate of other traffic on all trails.
- Yield to skiers on a downhill run.
- Make every effort to clear the trail if you stop or fall.
- Do not walk or snowshoe on either skier set or machine set ski tracks on marked ski trails. Note: Skiers may choose to skin up or run down a snowshoe track that is marked or

may even parallel a ski trail to avoid breaking trail but that is their choice.

- Ski under control always; avoid trails that are beyond your ability.
- Register your trip at the trail sign-in locations; use trail maps and signs to plan your trip.
- Let someone know where you will be and when you expect to return before leaving town. Then stick to those plans.
- Ski with a partner, especially on the ungroomed trails and back country ski runs.
- Make it a habit to carry the 10 "E's"; extra gear, water, snacks, flashlight, a compass or a GPS, trail or area maps, a cell phone (very poor reception if any except for on the ridge tops in most areas), and fire starting tools, even on short trips.
- Be aware that trail conditions can change greatly with changing snow, trail and weather conditions.
- Watch for and yield to trail grooming equipment.
- Keep your dogs under control (leash or in your immediate line of sight) and off of groomed tracks, and clean their refuse from the trail. Remember even other dog lovers do not care for someone else's dog showing up unsupervised, ill mannered, and leaving refuse in the trail.

### Avalanche Awareness Class

January 19-20, 2007 in Idaho Falls / Big Holes: Offered through the Idaho Parks and Recreation ORMV education program which is funded by the state ORMV sticker program (similar to Park 'n' Ski permits). If you own or have access to sleds and avalanche gear including transceivers, this awesome hands on class covers the 8 steps to reducing your avalanche risk in an evening class and out in the field (this is the day you do need sleds to ride into the Big Holes). The field portion even includes a mock burial. Note: Because the class is free, the sleds should have current ORMV stickers. We took this class this past January and the hands on portion was so realistic that a passing by group of a dozen or so snowmobilers stopped to help us.
