"A GUIDE'S PERSPECTIVE ON CLIMBING IN THE TETONS"

Climbing guide Sue Miller will present a slide show giving us her perspective on climbing in the Tetons at our January meeting. Sue will show slides of both some of the more popular Teton climbs as well as some less frequently visited routes. Come enjoy views of Teton climbs that you may already have some familiarity with while gathering ideas for less frequently climbed routes that you might want to try in the future.

Sue is a well rounded outdoorswoman, having worked for 20 years as a guide with Jackson Hole Mountain Guides. In addition to guiding in the Tetons, she has guided in the western U.S. and in Alaska, including Denali.

She has made four trips to the Himalaya and Karakoram. She has skied the Haute Route from Chamonix to Zermatt, climbing Monte Rosa in the process.

Other activities include coordinating avalanche classes for Jackson Hole Mountain Guides in the winter. Come spring, Sue can be found studying bald eagles along the Snake River.

Be sure to come and hear Sue's professional take on climbing in the mountain range we sometimes like to consider as our own back yard.

The meeting is open to the public and all outdoor enthusiasts are invited to attend.

As I write this, the snow is starting to fall bringing with it a whole new season of fun activities. Its time to trade-in your hiking boots for snowshoes or skies, and your climbing shoes for insulated boots and ice axes.

Winter brings us opportunities to have fun in many different ways but it also brings dangers that we don't have to deal with in the summer. Hypothermia and avalanches are the two biggest killers that we face in the winter months. Remember to dress in layers and wear your synthetic cloths (they will help keep you warm even if they are moist, cotton won't). Also make sure that that you take essential gear into the back-country like shovels, and transceivers. They can save your life but you need to know how to use them properly.

While some of us are out playing in the snow, others will be dreaming of next summer and putting in applications rafting permits to run one of the beautiful rivers in our area. If you fall into the last category don't forget the deadline for applications on most rivers is January 31. Hope you had a great holiday.

XCSkiing / Snowshoeing

Contact the Whithams 520.1728 or, xcski@idahoalpineclub.org for trip information, meeting location, and to sign up to go on a scheduled trip, unless otherwise indicated in the trip descriptions. Additional trips to be added over the winter, depending on conditions. If the roads are closed as many times as they were last year, or the weather too severe, the location of a trip may change or the trip may be canceled altogether.

All Trips Bring Your Own:

1. Water
2. Food/snacks

3. Dress in layers. Bring adequate extra Winter appropriate protective clothing-no cotton. Hat and gloves or mittens.
 4. Minor first aid items including sun screen, personal medications, as needed during the day.
 5. Headlamp (& Batteries)
 6. Map & Compass
 7. Sunglasses
 8. Lightweight shelter / space blanket.
 9. Appropriate equipment-skis or snowshoes, boots, poles, skins, shovel and avalanche transceiver depending on activity or terrain.
 - 10 Repair kit for your own equipment including duct tape and wax kit or glide liquid.
 - 11 Mat to sit on

January 1 Snowshoe Kelly

Canyon Nordic Area: Join us in welcoming in the new year with a snowshoe trip and an optional soak at Heise Hot Springs afterwards. The trails are adjacent to the Kelly Canyon Ski Resort about 30 - 45 minutes NE of town.

January 10 XCSki: Brimstone:

The trailhead is a Park-n-Ski area and is located ¼ mile north of the Island Park Ranger Station near Ponds Lodge Resort. There are four large loops classified as beginner to intermediate. The terrain varies from gentle grades to downhill runs through tree groves. There are nine miles of trail in this area. Bring binoculars. This is also Eagle count with Audubon.

January 11 XCSki or Snowshoe

at Harriman State Park: Meet at the park to Classic or skate ski the over 10 miles of groomed trails at Harriman State Park. Day pass is \$2 plus parking fee approx. \$4.

January 18 XCSki Ricks Basin:

Depending on conditions we will skate or XC ski on the groomed Nordic trails at Grand Targhee Resort. There are 10 miles of groomed trails that range from beginner to advanced. Day passes are \$10 for adults and \$5 for seniors or children.

Big Holes Mtn. Bike Trail Maps

New US Forest Service maps of the Palisades and Teton Basin Ranger Districts have been posted on the Caribou-Targhee National Forest website. To see them go to:

<http://www.fs.fed.us/r4/caribou-targhee/caribou-targhee/palisades/maps.shtml> for the map index) reflecting the new summer travel plan for the Big Holes and some trail number changes elsewhere.

These changes are reflected a set of 10 maps covering all of the Palisades and Teton Basin Ranger Districts at a scale of 1:112,500. Twelve "specialty" trail maps have also been revised. These are hiking scale maps, 1:50,000 scale, covering popular hiking, ATV and motorcycle trail areas. One entirely new map shows the newly designated and constructed mtn biking trails in the Horseshoe Canyon area west of Driggs. These color maps are free for download and the only current maps available to the public. The trail designations are now legally enforceable.

These changes are reflected a set of 10 maps covering all of the Palisades and Teton Basin Ranger Districts at a scale of 1:112,500. Twelve "specialty" trail maps have also been revised. These are hiking scale maps, 1:50,000 scale, covering popular hiking, ATV and motorcycle trail areas.
