Climbing

Grand Teton:

August 16th, 17th, & 18th

This is the big one. The Grand Teton is the crown jewel of the Teton Range, and a must do for any aspiring mountaineers. There are no walk up routes to the top. All routes require solid technical climbing ability. Participants in this trip must have demonstrated competency in all aspects of mountaineering. Climbing, belaying, rappelling, massive exposure, carrying big packs, moving fast over rough terrain, and dealing with the Teton's unpredictable August weather are all needed skills for this trip. Sign up will begin in July, and applicants must be active participants in other club climbing trips this summer to be considered.

Route selection will depend on conditions (of course), and participant skill and desire. Upper Exum Ridge or Owen-Spaulding routes will be the most likely choices. We will reserve a camp site in the moraines for 2 nights, but if all goes well we'll only need one.

We will hike in on Friday, set up camp, and try for the summit early Saturday morning. This schedule helps to beat most of the weekend crowd. Park regulations limit us to 6 climbers.

2007 Wednesday Evening Climbing Schedule:

Meeting places for the climbs: If we are heading north (Ririe, Heise, or Paramount) we will continue to meet at the McDonalds by Fred Meyer. If we are heading south (Blackfoot or Ross Park), we will meet at the climbing gym. This means less driving and more climbing.

July 18-22 - South Fork Boise (class III-IV) - Contact Jim Lee 524-5836. Sixteen mile long day section with no services camping near launch site. We will launch around noon each day. Bring your own boat.

Trail Maintenance

July 20-21 - Sheep Creek Trail:

The Alpine Club will support the Palisades Ranger District by conducting tread work (trail widening) on the Sheep Creek Trail (trail 096, non motorized), July 20 and 21, Friday and Saturday. We will meet Dave Woodcock at the trailhead at 8:00 am on Friday, camp that night at the trailhead and work again on Saturday. Bring all your own camping gear and food. Dave will provide the tools and animals to haul the equipment but we will start work on the bottom end of the trail and work our way up. Our support is part of the larger project which will include drilling and blasting the upper portion of the trail to provide a 24 inch wide trail. July 7, 2007, Saturday: Hell's Half Acre from Hwy 20

Round trip approx. 11 miles. Trip Coordinator: Sam Pole. Let's try this again. Dry rocky hike over basalts to volcanic vent and back. Fairly

easy hike over relatively flat terrain with somewhat uneven footing. Meet at the West-side Walmart, garden area, 8:30 a.m.

July 12, 2007, Thursday: Craters of the Moon west of Arco, Idaho. Another make-up hike.

Round trip approx. 6 miles not counting short side trips to view various volcanic features off the main trail. Trip Coordinator: Sam Pole. An easy hike under desert conditions. Will proceed out to Echo Crater, and beyond if the group wishes and time allows. Meet at the West-side Walmart, garden area, 8:30 a.m.

July 28, 2007, Saturday. Glory Bowl, Tetons. Sam Pole, leader, 456-2924. A stroll in the Tetons.

The hike begins in Teton Pass east of Victor Idaho; climbs to the top of Glory Bowl; and then meanders along the mountain crests to Ski Lake or beyond to the Teton Crest Trail; then returns to the highway below and east of Teton Pass. Strenuous for first 0.5 mile then approximately 5.5 mile moderate rambling hike out.. Elevation gain in the first 0.5-mile climb above Teton Pass is approximately 1400 feet. Meet at the Ammon Walmart, garden area at 8:00a.m. We are meeting earlier because this hike can be longer than the norm. Can return directly to IF or eat in Victor before returning home.

Trip Reports

May 26. Sam Pole, Ken Krivanek and Ken's dog Sam had a beautiful hike above the Snake River canyon. The weather was perfect (Blue skies, moderate temp) and no one else around.

June 14, Sam Pole, Bruce Anderson, Susan McKinley, Mel Edmondson, Edna Cardenas, and Mike Fryer enjoyed a beautiful day in Blowout Canyon. After missing the turn-off for the road into Blowout we ventured up through the slide debris with political, environmental and philosophical discussions going full tilt. Though we solved no world problems, a fine time was had by all.

June 9, 2007 - West Yellowstone to Warm River: Seven riders participated in this annual Alpine Club trip. Jeff Coward, Ken Krivanek, and Peter Shaw rode the entire 50 mile distance, while Donna Nicklaus, Sandy Pew, Dave Heath, and Joe Groberg rode the section from West Yellowstone to Big Springs, where we stopped for lunch. Dave also rode about 5 miles up from Warm River to meet the riders coming down, and provided primary transport for the riders and bikes to West Yellowstone. We did not take the 4 mile side trip to Warm River Springs this year.

Weather conditions this year were excellent, with sunshine, reasonable temperatures, and light breezes. Most of the wildflowers were already done blooming this year, so we didn't see large fields of them as we have in past years. However, there was an abundant variety of wildlife. There were three moose on the trail near Big Springs. We had to wait for them to move off into the forest before proceeding down the trail. Other sightings included four sandhill cranes, one antelope, two swans, an eagle, and a groundhog on the trail. The water level in the ponds was

considerably lower than usual due to the less than normal snowpack this year. The views of the Tetons with recent snow were also excellent.

There were quite a few people rafting and canoeing on the river downstream from Big Springs, and we saw several groups of motorized riders on ATV's and motorcycles. They were more courteous than some motorized riders we have met in previous years. The number of motorized riders has increased dramatically in the past few years. Five years ago, we would not see any riders of any type on the long straight middle section of the trail, but the entire trail is now being used by motorized riders.

May 19, 2007 - Sheep Bridge Trail Mtn Bike Ride: Teak, Danelle and Dan Cummings and Bob Tyler enjoyed an uneventful ride on the short Sheep Bridge Trail in Teton Canyon. For those who ski the road in Teton Canyon in the winter, the Sheep Bridge Trail would be an enjoyable alternative. It parallels the road to the south and, like the road, is flat and easy but without the crowds.

Free Maps:

By the time you are reading this, 10 more of Alan's color topographic maps at a scale of 1:112,500 covering the entire Dubois Ranger District of the Caribou-Targhee National Forest will be available for free download from the National Forest web site: <http://www.fs.fed.us/r4/caribou-targhee/maps/>. These maps complement maps of the Palisades and Teton Ranger District that were posted last year. There are also 5 specialty (more detailed) maps of the Dubois District covering popular trail use areas including: Trail Creek, Stoddard Creek, Eightmile Canyon, Signal Peak and Webber Creek. Hard copies of the specialty maps will be available from the Dubois Ranger District. On this page there is an index map showing an 8 page map that covers the entire ranger district and connecting areas at a scale of 1:112,500. Each map must be downloaded separately and they can be pasted together to form one large map. Hard copies of these maps are not available from the FS. There are also 12 more detailed "Specialty" maps covering specific trails. These maps are at a scale of 1:50,000 with shaded relief and are detailed enough to replace USGS topographic maps in most cases. Coordinates of trailheads and key intersections are provided. Since the files are large, a high speed internet connection is needed.
